GENERAL INFORMATION

School Location:

Redeemer Academy is located at Pine Ridge PCA, 3900 South Hiawassee Road Orlando, FL 32835
 (In the Metrowest area across from Turkey Lake Park)

Cost for Core Academic Classes:

\$250 registration fee includes textbooks and materials.
 Tuition for High School 1A & 2A is \$1,750, or \$175 per month over 10 months.

Cost for Math Classes:

\$75 registration fee includes textbook/answer key use and handouts
 \$750 or \$75 per month/10 months

Tuition is due the first school day of each month August through May. Late fees may apply.

Classes begin in August 2010 and end in May 2011, generally following Orange County's calendar. A calendar with actual dates will be given to families who register for classes.

All classes include tests, use of textbooks and answer keys, grading, weekly assignment sheets, and grade reports. High School classes also include a year-end grade report, course codes, and overview report (to assist in record-keeping).

CLASS GUIDELINES

The goal of these guidelines is to help create a suitable learning environment at home and in the class.

No food in the classroom. Snacks and lunches must be eaten outside, except on special days.

Do not attempt to complete your all weekly assignments at one time. You must work on them daily. If you leave your work until the last minute, it will suffer in quality. **Parents, it is vital that you make sure your child is not falling behind during the week.**

All writing assignments (unless specifically noted) are to be typed and turned in as a physical copy. Please use 10 or 12 pt. Times New Roman or Arial. **Parents, please make sure your printer is in working condition.**

I will accept late work up to one week past the deadline. All late work receives an automatic one letter grade deduction. Special circumstances will be considered.

Parents, I will be at school one half hour before and after class times. Your student may not be on campus unattended. Please drop your student off and pick them up accordingly.
